### **March 1945**

March started with the continuation of operations in the Hochwald with the Battalion fully involved. On the 5<sup>th</sup> the regrouped ready to continue ops towards Sonsbeck and Xanten. On the 9 they were withdrawn to Belgium to rest and refit in Haecht.

On the 28 the Battalion crossed the Rhine at Wesel.

Brig Churcher visited the Battalion on 12<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> - it is most probable this photo was taken during one of those visits.
